# **Charging Fees for Assistance with Claims**

- 38 CFR §14.636 Payment of fees for representation by agents and attorneys in proceedings before Agencies of Original Jurisdiction and before the Board of Veterans' Appeals.
- 38 CFR §14.637 Payment of the expenses of agents and attorneys in proceedings before Agencies of Original Jurisdiction and before the Board of Veterans' Appeals.

# **Understanding the Prohibition on Charging Fees**

- The prohibition has been upheld by the US Supreme Court
- Many people in charge, including members of Congress, leaders of VSOs and even the Office of General Counsel believe the prohibition applies to any individual
- The prohibition on charging fees applies only to individuals who have been accredited through the Department of Veterans Affairs
- The history of Title 38 USC § 5905 as the source of the original prohibition on charging fees
